#### > Ebola

- 4 distinct species that cause disease in humans
- Ebola virus was first discovered in 1976 near the Ebola River in what is now the Democratic Republic of Congo





- o Ebola Travel Screening
  - ✓ Currently, travelers from affected areas are being routed to identified airports in the US
  - ✓ LDH / ID Epi are receiving traveler notifications from the CDC should anyone traveling from an affected area return to Louisiana. If so, follow up monitoring will be conducted.
  - ✓ Louisiana clinicians with concerns about a patient with suspected EVD should immediately contact the Infectious Disease Epidemiology (IDEpi) 24/7 clinician hotline: 800-256-2748.
  - ✓ IF a patient has clinical symptoms consistent with VHF or EVD take a travel history! HAN from October 10<sup>th</sup>, 2022: <u>HANS22-33-Update-Ebola-Virus-Disease-Outbreak-Central-Uganda.pdf</u>

#### > Influenza & RSV

- o ILI activity is at 5.85%, which is above the regional baseline of 3.9
- Activity is increasing, those <25 account for 77% of all ILI visits
- Percent positivity from clinical laboratories is at 12.9%
- No influenza-associated pediatric deaths have been reported nationwide to CDC so far this season.
- Rhinovirus continues to have the highest circulation of non-influenza viruses, but Parainfluenza activity is increasing

<u>WEATHER UPDATE (NWS):</u> Roger Erickson, Meteorologist-N-Charge – <u>Discussed - FIRST ALERT FORECAST:</u>

- Wednesday, Morning, November 9, 2022
  - KPLC7sunrise Warm days are numbered as a long duration cool down arrives by Saturday



- US National Weather Service Lake Charles Louisiana
  - Mostly sunny and slightly cooler days are ahead as cool air arrives from the east. While temperatures will remain well above average today and tomorrow, we don't foresee record breaking heat like we have the last two days. (The only exception is at New Iberia where, today, we may tie the record high temperature of 85F set in 1950)
  - Otherwise in the forecast, temperatures will feel much cooler tonight and tomorrow with lows in the low 50s to low 60s and highs in the upper 70s to near 80. Those in western portions of the area may run into patchy fog tomorrow morning, but it'll mix out shortly after sunrise.

Discussed - The 2023 Airshow: Joshua Arnold, Program Manager/Fire Chief

- Chennault International Airport Fire Department is *requesting assistance* w/the 2023 Airshow
  - The next Airshow is scheduled for Friday, May 19th thru Sunday, May 21st, 2023, and/or asking for additional support for this
  - Those that have not had any involvement with us from previous shows, the days could be more than 12 hours of operation per day
  - There may be requirements for particular equipment the week leading to the show depending on requirements from different performers
  - The dates and times for this are unknown currently (*TBD*)
  - Anyone with ARFF training or experience would be preferred
- Please *note*, that due to the circumstances of the event, if you cannot meet all the criteria below, we will not be able to utilize your department for this

- 1. In need of a small rapid response vehicle with firefighting capabilities. This could be as small as a UTV or as large as a small brush truck similar to what we refer to as a rapid response vehicle. If the apparatus has foam capabilities, this would be preferred
- **2.** In need of an engine or pumper to provide fire response on the crowd side of the show mostly for the food truck areas or to respond to the parking area for incidents there
- **3.** Once the units are here, they are dedicated to the show and cannot leave until the show is complete and the crowds have left
- **4.** There cannot be any crew changes. The crews that arrive with the units must remain here until the show is complete. There will not be anyone available to escort the crews to enter/leave and no one will be available to brief them on what needs to be done once the show starts.
- **5.** At least one ranking member of the crews that will be here for the shows will need to attend the emergency responder meetings that will be held to brief all responders on their duties for the show. The emergency plans will be distributed to them so they know who to report to and what role they will be assigned to in the event of emergencies at the show.
