WEATHER UPDATE (NWS): Doug Cramer, Warning Coordination Meteorologist –

Discussed - KPLC 7 Weather First Alert Forecast, Wednesday, May 8, 2024:

- LAKE CHARLES, La. (KPLC) A southern breeze is holding across SWLA but won't be doing much to reduce temperatures while we wait for better rain chances.
- There is some slight potential for morning fog heading out the door, but the breeze is keeping formation to a minimum for most of the area similar to Tuesday.
- Warm and generally muggy conditions continue Wednesday. The breeze is still holding out of the south, but gusts aren't looking as high as some models originally predicted, leaving less room for more sunshine. That said, we will still see gusts up to 20 mph or slightly higher, and more sunshine will be around for the afternoon. Temperatures are really starting to get hot for some, afternoon highs will generally be in the mid to upper 80's. A few areas further north might hit 90°, which will be near record highs for the day. The heat index also will likely exceed 90 degrees in most areas through at least Thursday, so make sure to stay hydrated if you are spending long amounts of time outdoors.
- Rain will be very limited at best and probably no rain at all for most of the area; if we see any rain it would likely only be sprinkles or very light showers with lower chances than yesterday.



• By Thursday a cold front will slowly move into SWLA from the northwest, and this will likely increase the rain chance slightly. Models are not showing much rain with the front, but we will continue to monitor the trends on that over the coming days. That front won't fully move through until sometime Friday, so rain chances will remain at 20% through Friday.



- If thunderstorms do move into our area, they could be strong to severe, but the bigger question is IF storms reach SWLA or remain well north and east of our area. The timing of those storms would be late Thursday night into Friday morning.
- Temperatures will drop behind the front with morning lows being the most noticeably different. Morning lows will fall back into the low 60s over the weekend! Afternoon highs will not be a noticeably different with highs still reaching the low to mid 80s.
- Models are now showing a trough of low pressure moving across our area Sunday into Monday. This would normally mean a decent chance of rain, which is now in the forecast for Sunday (30%) and Monday (40%); some potential for heavy rain may exist depending on how this system evolves with time.



- We will begin to warm up next week and there does not appear to be any major weather systems heading toward SWLA. The next system may bring rain late next week as well.
- We are still dealing with flooding along area rivers and waterways; please heed local warnings and advisories on any potential closures and other protective measures. Do not drive through flood waters if you do not know how deep the water is. You can find the latest river stages by clicking HERE.

Discussed - KPLC 7 Weather First Alert Forecast, Tuesday, May 7, 2024: Joseph Ink:

- LAKE CHARLES, La. (KPLC) Breezy conditions in SWLA will accompany the high humidity for the next several days, but better rain chances are just out of reach for now.
- Warm and muggy conditions stick with us Tuesday, and likely for the next several days as well. Morning fog shouldn't be an issue for most heading out the door, but mostly cloudy skies will hold back some of the sunrise. Mostly cloudy skies will become partly cloudy in the afternoon, letting in some limited sunshine, and helping to push temperatures into the mid and upper 80's. Heat indices could easily push over 90° in many areas, so make sure you stay hydrated if spending time outdoors.
- A gusty southern breeze will at least keep the air moving, with gusts up to 20 mph throughout the day. Rain chances will be very limited to only sprinkles or very light showers, which will be more likely before lunchtime but a small chance at that.



- Conditions are expected to remain warm and muggy with morning lows in the low to mid 70s and afternoon highs in the mid to upper 80s for the next several days. The heat index will likely exceed 90 degrees in most areas through at least Thursday. Rain will be very limited at best and possibly no rain at all through Wednesday.
- By Thursday a cold front will move into SWLA from the northwest, and this will likely increase the rain chance slightly. Models are not showing much rain with the front at the moment, but we will continue to monitor the trends on that over the

coming days. That front won't fully move through until sometime Friday, after which we could see some improvement in

temperatures.



• Temperatures will drop behind the front with morning lows being the most noticeably different behind a more northerly wind shift. Morning lows will fall back into the low 60s over the weekend! Afternoon highs will not be noticeably different with highs still reaching the low to mid 80s. As far as the weekend goes, we will have to keep an eye on rain potential. Models are expecting another disturbance to move through the area which could push our rain chances a little higher, but we will have to see if the trend holds as we approach the weekend.



- We will begin to warm up next week and there does not appear to be any major weather systems heading toward SWLA.
- We are still dealing with flooding along area rivers and waterways; please heed local warnings and advisories on any potential closures and other protective measures. Do not drive through flood waters if you do not know how deep the water is. You can find the latest river stages by clicking HERE.
