Louisiana Region R5 ESF-8 Health & Medical Coalition Meeting, met on Monday, April 28, 2025, to discuss:

• Public Health Update-Measles

* Dr. Cavanaugh provided an update on the current measles outbreak and guidance regarding actions to be taken if cases are suspected

Key Messages

- o The Louisiana Department of Health is closely monitoring ongoing measles outbreaks in neighboring states
- o Louisiana has confirmed 2 cases of measles in 2025 associated with international travel. Epi investigation is ongoing
- o In 2024, Louisiana had 3 travel-associated cases. Prior to 2024, the last cases of measles occurred in 2018
- o Measles is an acute, highly contagious viral disease
- o Anyone who has been vaccinated with the measles, mumps, rubella (MMR) vaccine is well-protected against the virus
- Symptoms Typically appear 7-14 days after exposure
 - o Fever
 - Cough
 - o Runny nose
 - o Red/watery eyes
 - Koplik spots
 - o Rash, often beginning on the face at the hairline and spreading to the neck, trunk, arms, legs, and feet
- What should I do if I encounter a potential measles case? Refer to provider guidance
 - o ISOLATE
 - > Provide a procedural mask for the patient; place in a single room with the door closed or place patient in Airborne Infection Isolation Room (AIIR) if available
 - o INFORM
 - ➤ Call IDEpi at **1-800-256-2748** to request approval for lab testing, infection control support, and exposure follow up
 - PREVENT
 - > HCP should use N95 respirator AND have documented evidence of immunity



Enhanced Case Detection in LA

- o PCR testing is recommended and available with quick turnaround time through the SPHL
- Testing approval by LDH is required; providers evaluating suspected cases should call IDEpi's clinician hotline: 800-256-2748
- Recommendations for preventing healthcare exposure are issued immediately upon report of suspected case




- Preparing for a measles outbreak

 - O Know the immunity status of your staff
 - Close monitoring of regional outbreak and communication with affected states
 - Challenges experienced by other jurisdictions
 - ➤ Communication with patients/families
 - ➤ Willingness to test
 - Acceptance of public health prevention recommendations

US National Weather Service Lake Charles, Wednesday, May 14, 2025:

- Unseasonably warm and humid conditions are expected today that will bring about a Minor to Moderate Heat Risk. Stay hydrated and try to stay cool
- The hot and humid conditions with no rain will continue during the remainder of the week into the weekend
- For the marine interests, elevated southerly winds will be found across the coastal waters into Thursday. A small craft advisory will be in effect
- Finally, the Calcasieu River at White Oak Park will continue to fall and is expected to be below Moderate Flood category into Minor Flood category later this afternoon

LAKE CHARLES, LA (KPLC 7) Weather First Alert Forecast, Wednesday, May 14, 2025: Jacob Durham, Meteorologist – Windy and warm afternoon ahead, as heat indices slowly climb to end the week

- LAKE CHARLES, La. (KPLC) We're are rinse and repeating as we head through our Wednesday as temperatures warm with a mixture of sun and clouds
- Temperatures will continue to climb as we head through the afternoon as we are once again back into the middle and upper 80s



- Humidity as returned thanks to our strong southerly winds and that will allow us to have more of a heat index through the afternoon hours
- Winds will also be a factor throughout the day as gust near 30-40 mph at times making it feel a little more comfortable
- High pressure will continue to keep things nice and quiet as we head through the remainder of the week as we slowly warm a little more
- Most inland communities are making a run at 90 degrees for the first time this year as we head into Thursday and Friday



- Even though areas along the I-10 corridor may not officially hit 90, it will certainly feel more like the lower to middle 90s thanks to the humidity
- Rain chances continue to remain minimal at best with most areas staying quiet through the weekend



- There is a small chance for a stray shower as we head through Friday and Saturday as we see the daytime heating coupled with the humidity
- We won't see much change as we head through next week either as sunshine remains in place as well as the warmer weather



- Our best rain chances look to come through the middle of next week as high pressure slowly weakens and moves away US National Weather Service Lake Charles, Louisiana, Tuesday, May 13, 2025:
 - Above normal temperatures are expected to begin today, with highs ranging from the upper 80s to 90s. Heat indices will
 climb into the upper 90s and low 100s. While temperatures may not reach record-breaking levels, they will fall just a few
 degrees short
 - The GIF displays the forecasted heat risk for the next seven days. Today, only minor impacts are anticipated. However, beginning tomorrow, widespread moderate heat risk conditions are expected to persist, with some areas experiencing major to even extreme levels. A legend explaining these risk categories is provided at the bottom of the image
 - *Please note:* the dewpoint sensor at the Allen Parish site has been reporting unusually high values. This may result in an overestimation of the heat risk in that area
 - Stay cool and hydrated!

LAKE CHARLES, LA (KPLC 7) Weather First Alert Forecast, Tuesday, May 13, 2025: Jacob Durham, Meteorologist – Sunshine and warmth building, as strong winds build into Wednesday

- LAKE CHARLES, La. (KPLC) Our area of low pressure continues to drift away as high pressure is building in for the next week to week and a half
- Thankfully we are looking at plenty of sunshine over the next few days allowing water levels to recede along the rivers and for our backyards to dry out



- High temperatures will be gradually warming as well as we are heading back into the middle 80s for Tuesday afternoon with a breezy afternoon ahead.
- Winds will gust out of the south once again, as humidity slowly builds with gust nearing 20-30 mph at times.



- Even stronger winds are likely heading into our Wednesday as we could easily see some gust near or just over 40 mph
- One thing is for sure though, and that's warmer weather is here to stay as many areas are looking at hitting 90 degrees for the first time this year



- Overnight lows will be more noticeable as well as the humidity builds and keeps us much warmer into the lower and middle 70s
- Each afternoon will gradually warm as well as many areas look to be at or just above 90 for Thursday and into the weekend



- For those with outdoor plans, mother nature looks to cooperate as quiet weather will be with us right on into next week
- Outside of a stray shower Saturday, the best rain chances in the 10-day forecast don't arrive until late next week



• If you do plan on spending time outdoors or maybe by the pool, make sure to drink plenty of water to stay hydrated as well as wear that *sunscreen*
