

WEATHER UPDATE (NWS): Doug Cramer, Warning Coordination Meteorologist -

US National Weather Service Lake Charles, Wednesday, June 11, 2025:

• Another stormy afternoon is forecast across the region

• There is also a slight risk (risk level 2 of 5) for severe weather in Southeast Texas, mainly this afternoon



LAKE CHARLES, LA (KPLC 7) Weather First Alert Forecast, Wednesday, June 11, 2025: Jacob Durham, Meteorologist -

- Rinse and repeat is the name of the game as we head into Wednesday with yet another round of showers and storms
- We'll continue to see a mix of sun and clouds at times through the afternoon and evening, which will help to boost temperatures into the upper 80s to near 90



- Heat index values will be a factor when the sun is out with many areas feeling more like the triple digits at times
- All of this heat and humidity will act as fuel that the storms can tap into as we head through the second half of the day and that could present a few stronger storms



- Damaging winds, heavy rain and frequent lightning are the biggest concerns with any of the storms that developed and may force you outdoor plans back inside.
- There will be drier stretches of weather as well, but you'll need to keep a close watch to the sky and the *KPLC First Alert Weather App* for the latest information and check of radar.



- Unfortunately, there isn't much change with the forecast heading into Thursday as multiple rounds of showers and storms look likely once again
- Highs will stay steady through the next few days to a week as many areas are reaching the upper 80s to lower 90s as we will see some sunshine



- Scattered showers and storms will continue to stick around heading into Father's Day Weekend as well as we still have no real true cold front to change things up
- Even into next week we'll stay unsettled with periods of showers and storms through the middle half of the week.



• Finally, some drier weather looks to push in as we head towards the second half of next week with more sunshine as heat and humidity build

US National Weather Service Lake Charles, Louisiana, Tuesday, June 10, 2025:

- A few showers are ongoing across the area this morning, however higher coverage is anticipated this afternoon and evening
- There is a low-end risk of severe weather this afternoon as a line of storms moves across the region
- High rain chances will linger through the week and weekend.



LAKE CHARLES, LA (KPLC 7) Weather First Alert Forecast, Tuesday, June 10, 2025: Jacob Durham, Meteorologist –


- Thankfully for now we are seeing a nice break in the showers and storms as we await the arrival of our next piece of energy moving into Southwest Louisiana
- We'll start off our Tuesday with a mixture of sun and clouds, but it won't take long for the daytime heating to help spark some showers and storms



- High temperatures will once again head back into the upper 80s, close to 90 degrees before afternoon and evening storms fire up
- Our risk for severe weather still remains low, but not zero as heavy rain, frequent lighting, damaging winds, and large hail are possible



- We'll see storms taper off as we head into the overnight hours and that will lead to the potential for a little fog as we head into our Wednesday morning
- The warm and humid starts to continue for the next week as well as overnight lows struggle to dip back into the lower 70s



- Keep the rain gear nearby as showers and storms will persist into Wednesday as well with yet another round of storms likely heading through the middle half of the day
- The timing of the storms will be something we watch closely as it will likely change at times over the next 72 hours or so with each round of storms



- There isn't a true cold front to help kick the showers and storms out of the region, so we can expect the scattered storms to continue through the end of the week
- Good news is that not any set day is forecast to be a complete washout, so there will be times to get outside and enjoy



- This will go for Father's Day weekend as well with showers and storms remaining in the forecast, but more scattered in nature
- Highs will stay steady into the upper 80s to near 90 degrees as a mixture of sun and clouds will remain for almost every afternoon
- Even heading into next week the threat for showers and storms will linger as they slowly turn more isolated in nature to end next week
